



CAROLE BOSTON WEATHERFORD born and raised in Baltimore earned her Master of Arts in publications design from the University of Baltimore and a Master of Fine Arts from the University of North Carolina-Greensboro. She has authored more than two dozen children's books. Her two latest books are *Dear Mr. Rosenwald* and a Caldecott Honor Book, *Moses: When Harriet Tubman Led Her People to Freedom*.

Her first children's book, *Juneteenth Jamboree*, debuted in 1995. Since then she have received many literary honors. *The Sound that Jazz Makes* (2000) won the Carter G. Woodson Award from National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS) and an NAACP Image Award nomination. *Freedom on the Menu: The Greensboro Sit-Ins* (2005) and *Remember the Bridge: Poems of a People* (2002) both won the North Carolina Juvenile Literature Award. *Freedom on the Menu* was a finalist for the North Carolina Children's Book Award. *Remember the Bridge* was short-listed among the NCSS Notables, International Reading Association Teachers' Choices and Voices of Youth Advocates Poetry Picks.

She has five preschool titles, the latest of which is *Jazz Baby*.
